CHYAHOGA FALLS O

The town of Cuyahoga Falls has in the last few years become quite noted as a Summer Resort, and is annually visited by thousands of people. It is situated in Summit County, Ohio, and on the beautiful river Cuyahoga, from which, owing to its numerous falls and cascades at this point, the place is named; 38 miles South of Cleveland; 180 miles North of Columbus, and four miles from Akion, the County Seat; a large and flourishing city, is easily accessible by four daily express trains, on the Cleveland, Mount Vernon and Columbus Railroad.

Passing south through the main street, a walk of a quarter of a mile, brings one to a bridge which spans a narrow gorge in the liver, 100 feet above its bed.

Passing south through the main street, a walk of a quarter of a mile, brings one to a bridge which spans a narrow gorge in the river, 100 feet above its bed.

Here has been provided a rude stairway which leads down, to a broad plateau, where has been erected an ample building with a spacious dring room and kitchen attached, where dinner parties can be served on short notice; here too, under the same roof, is a fine restaurant, where Ice Cream, Nuts, Candles, Cigars and everything in the Refreshment line, can be tound; while just outside is a fine Croquet ground and numerous rusite seats, over-shadowed by high perpendicular rocks. Stepping down a few steps is Lover's Retreat, a broad ledge of rocks, shaded by large forest trees. Quitting these ledges, and passing down another flight of stairs hedged in by rustic work, close by the river side, we come upon a broad level surface and the entrance to Fern Cave, a large subterranean cavity, in the solid rock 5x x 5t feet in dimension; here and there are all kinds of rude seats, some of iron, others of wood, where the weary from climbing can rest. Water, pure and cold as ice, comes gushing from the rocks so that all who will may drink. Leaving the cave we pass down a strongly braced stairway, running diagonally with the face of the wall to Observation Rock, a huge stone of over 100 tons weight, from which, as one casts an eye up the stream, we get a fine view of the Water Falls, of heights varying from 15 to 20 feet, also High Bridge, some 80 feet above. Below and immediately inder Fern Cave is Dove's Retreat, a huge cavern with roof overhanging 25 feet above; to the right and a little down the rapids is Suspension Bridge, built above high water mark, of strong rods of iron reaching across the chasm and bedded irmly in huge boulders on each side, strong hand ralls make all feel safe from the surging and fonuning waters below. Departing from the Bridge, we are now on the east side and near Cuscade Point, a lovely re
